EASTCOTE TOWN CENTRE IMPROVEMENTS



Work is now well under way on the £1.3 million Town Centre Improvement Scheme in Field End Road, Eastcote. The old pavements are being replaced and more street lighting installed, plus there will be plenty of benches and bins. New trees and ground level plants will be grown in the planters. At the same time, grants have been awarded to 26 shops to improve their shop fronts and signage. Some have already been installed, like Premier Floors, shown right. BEST GREEN SPACES IN THE COUNTRY



Hillingdon Council has been awarded an outstanding 47 Green Flags, making it the local Authority with the highest number of top-quality parks and green spaces in the UK for the fifth year running.

In Eastcote and East Ruislip, work in our green spaces includes a water fountain by the King's Café, a dipping platform in Pinn Meadows drainage pool, and a re-surfaced gable end at Manor Farm House.

SCHOOL PLACES FOR HILLINGDON CHILDREN
